### Florida QSO Party Results:

Over 653 QSOs recorded and uploaded to the state site.

Worked 40 of 67 Florida counties, several DX stations, and all but one Canadian province.

Points appear to be several hundred higher than the previous year.

Special recognition was given to Greg – KK4LWB, Stephanie – K4MVO, Rick -, and Barry – N4NMF for their station QSO work over the weekend.

**ARRL Field Day:** Members were encouraged to monitor the Facebook group and email for volunteer sign-ups for ARRL Field Day located at Fox Lake park, Titusville Florida June 27 – 28!

### 8. New Business “Guest Speaker”

Guest Speaker: Frank Haas (K4BT), retired FPL Power Line Interference Investigator.

Presentation Summary:

- Frank discussed his 20-year career with FPL and his ongoing work helping clubs
- establish interference investigation teams.
- Key Advice: Always check internal home sources first (switching power supplies, LED lamps, elevator chargers, and doorbell transformers).
- Technical Insights: Power line interference is often caused by failing lightning arresters (which fail frequently in “thunderstorm alley”) or loose hardware on poles rather than the transformers themselves.
- Tools: Mentioned the use of direction-finding skills and Type 31/43 ferrites to mitigate noise.

### 9. Adjournment

The meeting was abbreviated to allow for the guest presentation. Meeting concluded for technical discussion and social time.

## TARC Tech Tip: Tracking RFI Like a Pro

If your noise floor is hovering at S9, you don't have to just "live with it." Here are the key takeaways from our April meeting on how to hunt down Radio Frequency Interference (RFI) without breaking the bank or your equipment.

### 1. The "Golden Rule" of Noise Hunting

Always hunt in **AM Mode**. Whether you are using your HF rig or a handheld receiver, AM mode makes the "sound" of interference—like the buzzing of a failing lightning arrester or the hum of a computer-controlled traffic light—much easier to identify. Sideband (SSB) and CW often mask the very signatures you need to hear.

### 2. Essential Gear for Your Toolkit

You don't need an \$8,000 professional investigator's kit to find the source.

- **The Receiver:** The **Tecsun PL-680** (approx. \$140) is a club favorite. It covers HF, Airband, and Shortwave, and it's battery-operated for easy "fox hunting" around the neighborhood.
- **The Antenna:** For precise direction finding, the **National RF "Vector Gun"** is the gold standard for hams. This loop system allows you to find sharp nulls to point you directly at the offending source.

### 3. Common "Local" Culprits

Before you blame the power lines, check your own backyard:

- **LED Power Supplies:** Specifically outdoor floodlights.
- **Traffic Lights:** Many intersections have computer controllers that bleed noise onto the high end of the AM band (around 1710 kHz).
- **The Neighbors:** Plasma TVs are mostly in landfills now, but older sets can still wipe out entire bands.

### 4. Working with the Utility (FPL)

If the noise is coming from a pole, **do not take a sledgehammer to it**. Not only is it dangerous, but it's also a great way to get arrested. Instead:

- **Call it in:** Contact the utility for an RFI investigation.
- **The Etiquette Rule:** Always be polite to the investigator (currently Paul Chamay). If you antagonize the technician, your case may find its way to the bottom of the stack.

**Want to help?** TARC is looking to form a dedicated **Interference Investigation Team**.

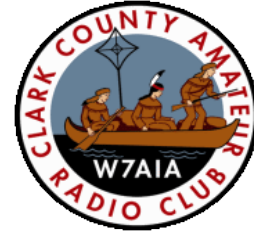
Date: June 6 - 21, 2026

The Lewis and Clark Trail on the Air special event is an on air activity that commemorates the historic Lewis and Clark Trail. The trail covers 4900 miles through 16 states. This includes the disembarkation from Camp Dubois and what is referred to as the Eastern Legacy. The event is sponsored by the Clark County Amateur Radio Club with support and participation from clubs in all 16 states along the historic trail.

Simple Rules: Contact one club in each of the 16 states on the historic Lewis and Clark Trail. There are 2 bonus stations that may each be substituted for a missing state to get to a 16 state total. Operating modes include SSB Phone, FM Phone, CW and FT8/FT4. Any combination of modes towards working all 16 states and bonus stations is allowed.
