General Membership Meeting Minutes**

Date: June 23, 2026 **Time:** 7:00 PM EDT **Location:** Masonic Lodge, Titusville, Florida

Chaired By: Diane (N4DCK), President

1. Call to Order & Welcome

- **Call to Order:** President Diane (N4DCK) called the meeting to order at 7:00 PM.
- **Pledge of Allegiance:** Vice-President Keith (W4KWD) led the membership in the Pledge of Allegiance.

Introductions: Attendees went around the room introducing themselves by name, call sign, and home city. A warm welcome was extended to all visitors, including a new visitor Mike McClary (N6MO) originating from Cupertino, California.

2. New Member Applications & Approvals

- An application was presented for new member JoAnn Sullivan KR4NDW, who recently passed her licensing exam.
- An application was presented for William Meyer.

Action taken: Both applications were formally voted on and unanimously approved by the membership.

3. Officer Reports

• **Treasurer's Report:**

- The club experienced a quiet financial month.
- **Income:** \$0.84 (earned via savings and checking account dividends).
- **Total Cash Balance:** \$9,916.08.
- *Motion to approve:* Formally moved, seconded, and passed.

○ **Secretary's Report:**

Motion to approve: A motion was made and seconded to accept the minutes from the May 26, 2026, meeting as published in the early June 2026 issue of the club *Communicator*. The motion carried.

4. Committee & Coordinator Reports

Net Coordinator Report (Barry, N4NMF)

The club currently coordinates five weekly nets at 7:00 PM, typically drawing 7 to 10 participants each:

Technical Committee Report (Dave, KY4F)

- All club repeaters are fully up and running.
- The PL tone timer settings change (146.970 MHz) has been successfully resolved.
- Investigations have begun into linking the repeaters together.
- A previously noted software password issue has been resolved.

Repeater Power Status: It was noted that the club repeaters are functionally resilient, including setups utilizing solar power and generator backups.

Public Information Officer (PIO) Report (Greg Hand, KK4LWB)

Titusville Library Outreach: The monthly membership and information drives at the Titusville Public Library initiated this month. Held on the third Saturday of the month from 10:00 AM to 2:00 PM inside the air-conditioned vestibule, the event saw excellent foot traffic with over 100 visitors.

- **Materials & Displays:** The TARC Library setup features a standout banner, and A-Frame road sign, a club-owned all-in-one computer w/ Windows 11 and Microsoft Office, abbreviated copies of the Club *Communicator* newsletter, Tri-Fold TARC Brochures, Tri-Fold POTA Brochures, and promotional QR-code reusable grocery bags for distribution.
- **Watch Bill:** Mike Elledge (KC4JEM) and Greg Hand (KK4LWB) will anchor the table for the next two months to streamline operations before establishing a revolving 12-month club volunteer watch bill (two-person teams per month).

5. Old & New Business

- **Downtown 4th of July Booth:** Mayor Connors approached the club regarding setting up an outreach booth in downtown Titusville for the upcoming July 4th celebration (events begin at 9:00 AM, concluding with evening fire-works). Due to the short notice for coordinating equipment and manning shifts, the club discussed looking into a formal contact point via the mayor's office to potentially target a fully planned rollout for July 4th, 2027.

Emergency Communication Protocols: Mike Elledge (KC4JEM) is heading up a new working group alongside Steve Schindler (NA4SA) and Roy Merritt (N4RKM) to establish clear club emergency communication protocols. The initiative will focus on backup messaging methods for family members during internet outages, checking local repeater operational limits, and identifying members with whole-house generators who can offer support (e.g., emergency freezer space) during heavy regional flooding. Further details will be published in the *TARC Communicator*.

6. ARRL Summer Field Day Training & Logistics

Greg Hand (KK4LWB) and Mike Elledge (KC4JEM) conducted a briefing ahead of the upcoming **ARRL Summer Field Day at Fox Lake Park (June 27–28, 2026)**.

- **Location & Setup:** Held at Pavilion 2. Signs will be posted along the entry loop. Setup begins **Saturday, June 27 at 10:00 AM**. Volunteers are strongly urged to arrive early to assist.
- **Operation Timeline:** On-air operations run continuously for 24 hours starting **Saturday at 2:00 PM through Sunday at 5:00 PM**.
- **Station & Antenna Lineup (Class 4A - up to 4 simultaneous transmitters):**
 - *Station 1:* Icom IC-7300 (Victor 1) paired with a Cushcraft A3S 3-band beam antenna (10/15/20 meters). Team led by Paul Fee (N6PDF).
 - *Station 2:* Icom IC-7300 (Victor 2) paired with a BuddyTex hex-beam antenna (20 through 6 meters). Team led by Roy Merritt (N4RKM).
 - *Station 3:* Icom IC-7300 (Victor 3?) paired with a fan dipole antenna (80/40/15 meters). Setup assistance by Mike Daniels (KW4DX).
 - *GOTA (Get On The Air) Station:* Available for unlicensed visitors, spouses, children, or newcomers to gain hands-on experience under the guidance of a licensed control operator. Team led by Roy Merritt (N4RKM).
- **Operator Tips:** Operators are welcome to bring an SD card containing personal Icom configurations. Members are also encouraged to bring their own headsets (most club operators use Heil variants, though standard 1/8" jacks are accessible).
- **Logging Software Tutorial:** Mike Elledge (KC4JEM) demonstrated the N3FJP Contest Log software (Field Day Version).
- The software is fully updated and will automatically load the club call sign (**K4KSC**), location data, and Class **4A / South Florida (SFL)** section.
- Operators must input their individual call sign and initials under the setup menu to ensure proper contact tracking.
- Duplicate contacts will generate an automatic warning. A paper notepad system will be available next to the rigs for operators who prefer to have a second member log data into the computer manually.
- **Hospitality & Food:**
- **Saturday Potluck:** Begins at 5:00 PM. The club will not be providing a primary meat protein; members must bring their own main dishes, dietary-specific meals, or sides to share.
 - **Daytime Provisions:** "Grab-and-go" lunch items for working volunteers will be stored in the back of the air-conditioned communications trailer to stay cool. All attendees are urged to stay hydrated.

7. Adjournment

Following the Field Day technical brief and an invitation for members to practice using the logging software interface at the front table, the floor was cleared. The meeting concluded ahead of individual training sessions. The meeting was adjourned by motion from the floor at 7:44 pm.

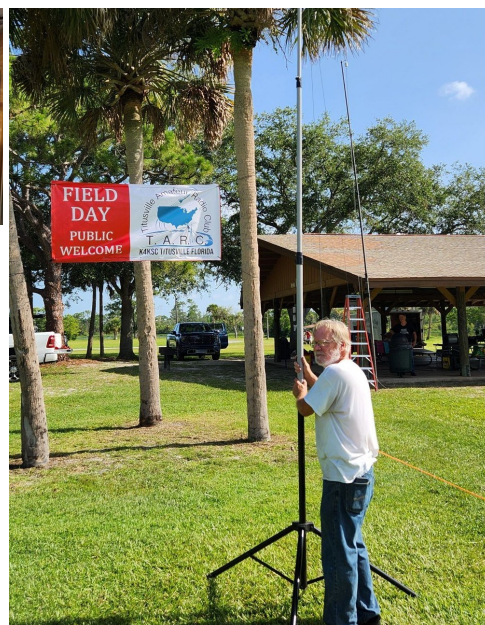
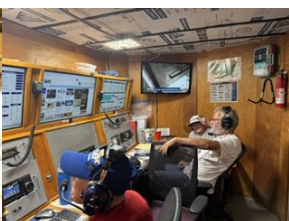

The title tells all. What could be better than playing ham radio in the outdoors? This picture defines POTA - Parks on the Air. Literally, going to a park, setting up a portable station, activating the park (explanation to follow), making many QSOs even with pile-ups from time to time and submitting your logs for credit.



Let me walk back a few steps. My journey into POTA was born with the help of a fellow ham and darn good radio operator named Lisa KC1 YL. She did a presentation at the St. Petersburg Amateur Radio club (SPARC) meeting that inspired me. I asked if she would mentor me and with open arms took me under wing. It was awesome. My first pile up was at a local park. Nothing short of 200 qsos in rapid order. From then on I was hooked. Becoming a POTA activator is very satisfying. You are top dog and every hunter out there wants to be logged.

So what do these terms mean? Well, in brief an activator is any ham who registers on the POTA website, goes to a recognized or sanctioned park and makes at least 10 QSOs. That log is then uploaded on the POTA website. See <https://pota.app/#/> Visit the website to learn all the details. Hunters, those aiming to make contact with activators are key to a successful activation. Hunters don't need to upload a log as the activator already does that for them. Also in the mix are Park to Park {P2P} q's. Logging these parks takes an extra step in logging. You need to copy their park and share your park numbers.

Sounds confusing but after 1 or 2 q's it becomes second nature.

Logging is easy with paper & pencil or various apps. Visit Google play store or IOS store for a list of apps.

So back to my story. During the year I aim to activate different parks, usually local ones first. Not all activations include camping as many of the parks don't offer camping. Example Palm Bluff Conservation Area US-8366. Notice the designations "US" stateside, and a 4 or 5 digit number. Other countries have different designations ie Canada "CA". The app provides all the info you will need.

Once you are registered it tracks all of your activity. As of today I have 130 activations, 36 unique parks, and 5935 q's. **Wow, I've been radioactive!** As I mentioned in the first paragraph to be a POT A activator you need to get out to a park. But then what? Well it's like a mini field day. You assemble equipment, maybe take a lunch and drinks, and spend time on the Air. Some parks provide electric, while others require you to use battery power. I am prepared for both. My POTA station consists of my Icom 7100 and tuner, a laptop or tablet/phone, 2 antennas (Chameleon tactical delts loop and Wolf River coil with 17' whip). I have 2 20 Ah LiPo batteries. A couple of cw keys.

Now I'm ready to go.

After setting up my camp site, to get back to my original story I log into the POTA app and register my info: POTA park, call sign of activator, spotter (same as activator but others can spot you too), operating frequency, and any comments. That achieved it's like field day just CQ POTA with your call. Typically others are seeing you spotted and tune to your frequency or the rbn net spots you. Be prepared as you may get a pile up immediately depending on band conditions. I like to jump around on different bands to give operators who may be limited to the other bands as a single band wire antenna, etc. Also mobile and QRP operators hang out on the other bands too. There are no limits to what band you operate on. Choose an area of the band that all ops have access to and avoid nets, areas allocated to special activity ie SSTV, PSK, WSJT.

So to sum it up, what is better than a day in the field playing ham radio? Nothing at all. POTA ON~ **Rick Bunton KB4MIS**
